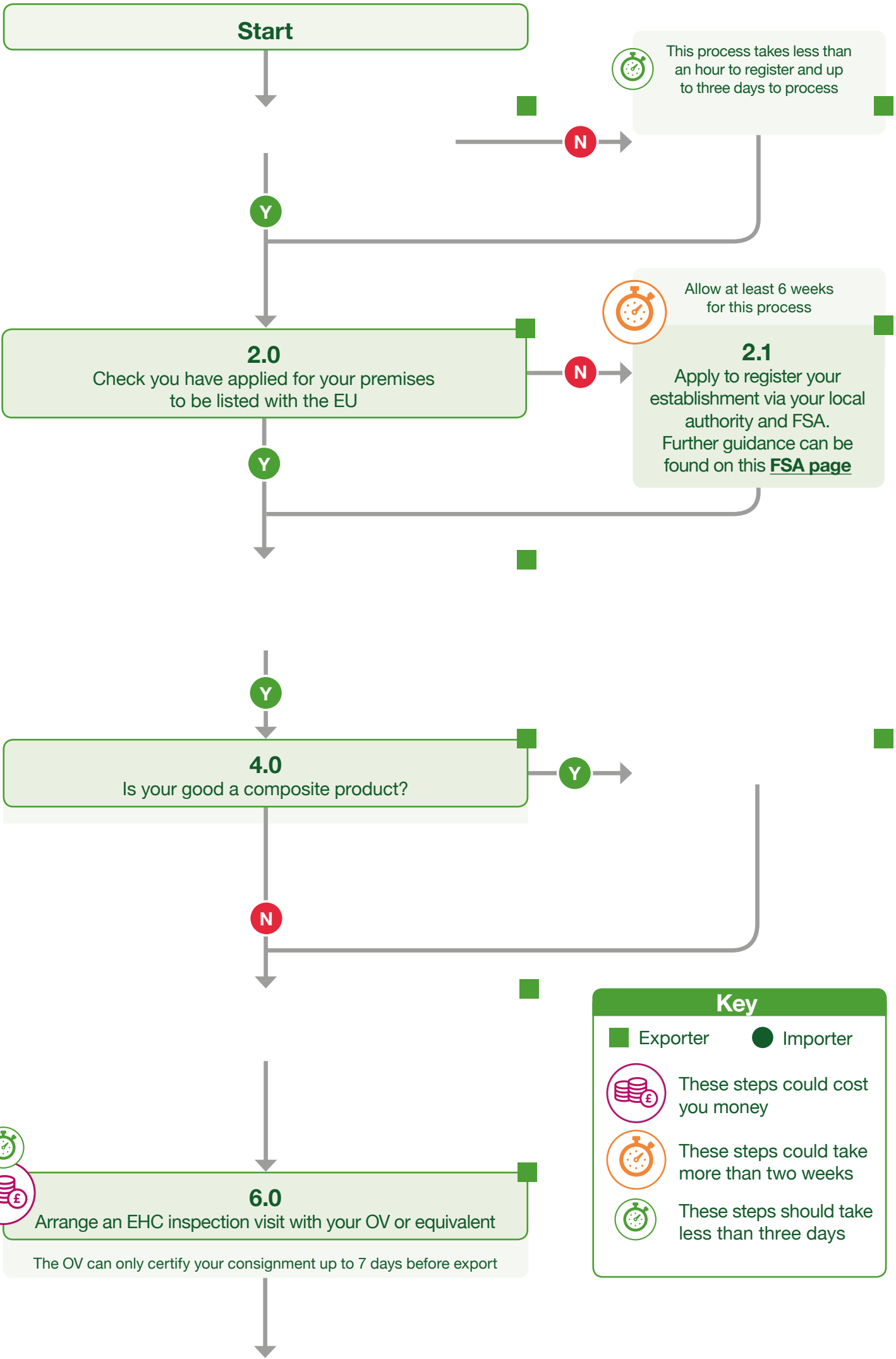
# FARMERS AND FOOD PRODUCERS

## You need to take new steps to export meat and dairy to the EU

The OV can only certify your consignment up to 7 days before export

- EHC** Export Health Certificate
- BIP** Border Inspection Post
- OV** Official Veterinarian
- FSA** Food Standards Agency
- EORI** Economic Operator Registration and Identification

Receive your completed and signed EHC and send a certified copy to your competent authority and EU importer

**9.0**  
Have you labelled your goods correctly?

**10.0**  
Your goods must enter the EU through the correct **BIP**.  
Check to see the route your goods must take

**11.0**  
Your EU importer now needs to submit a pre-notification on TRACES and upload the EHC

**12.0**  
Complete an export customs declaration via your export agent or do it **yourself**

**13.0**  
Your EU importer also needs to complete an import customs declaration on the EU Customs platform and they need to ensure that they have an EU EORI number

**14.0**  
Send your goods to the EU along with the original EHC

**15.0**  
Goods arrive at the EU BIP where they are checked

If your goods have failed inspection they can then be transformed, re-exported or destroyed

If your goods pass inspection they will then be released to your EU importer
