Due to cuts in government funding and in response to the recent financial challenges such as rising inflation and the impact of the cost-of-living crisis, the Council must ensure its budgets are balanced so that services can be maintained. This includes the implementation of a broad range of transformation initiatives to generate savings of £1.23 million.
