



### STEVENAGE MAJOR REFURBISHMENT CONTRACT PROJECT IMPACT REPORT YEARS 1, 2 & 3 UPDATE

#### **Project:**

Wates Living Space was appointed by Stevenage Borough Council in July 2018, alongside Mullaley to provide planned maintenance programmes across 450 blocks.

# Collaborative working and partnering

Following the SBC closing the Cartridge site, Wates have extended and refurbished another office to increase the space to allow SBC to have office space to continue the collaborative positive working from the last few years.

#### Monthly resident liaison meetings

These are meetings between Wates and Stevenage Borough Council staff around reviewing the programme of works, resident engagement and any no access properties etc.

#### Quarterly communications meetings

These meetings are held between SBC staff (with various departments i.e. Housing / Leasehold Services), to review the MRC programme and with each member providing updates.



These are similar to the communications meetings above but involve more detail.

#### Monthly contract progress meetings

These are carried monthly to review the MRC programme globally, this includes; progress against programme, KPI's and spend/cashflow forecast.

#### Quarterly cross county meetings

These meetings give the opportunity for all the departments within Stevenage to attend meetings with the main contractors, to run through all the major works schemes, including the MRC. This has been great for information sharing from ASB, refuse, cleaning and tenant services, so information can be shared and lessons learnt on the contract.

Following the Covid-19 pandemic, we continue to communicate regularly with SBC and consultants through various IT platforms to ensure a smooth delivery of the programme and communication.



# **Operational highlights**

- 110 blocks commence on the MRC programme
- 71 blocks have achieved practical completion
- 19 blocks are complete and waiting practical completion
- 20 blocks currently works in progress

#### Phase 1

- Practical completion achieved in December 2019 to 42nr blocks.

#### Phase 2

- Practical completion achieved in November and December 2020 on 29 of the 31 blocks.
- The remaining two blocks of year 2 have variations being designed with SBC and are currently planned for completion in early 2021.



Phase 2 block, 2-97 Roundmead – roof and rooflight replacement, cladding decorations, new windows and paving repairs.

# **Operational highlights**

#### Phase 3

- Batch 1 complete and due for practical completion December 2020 (19 blocks total)
- Batch 2 on site and progressing well, programme to complete in February 2021



Phase 2 block, 1a – 39a The Hyde completed roofing, windows, canopy repairs and external decorations.

Batch 3 Lonsdale Road
(11nr blocks) started October 2020 and planned completion in March 2021.

#### Garages

Wates have been supporting SBC on the new package of works on the garage scheme (158 garages) and has been a real success in all aspects form working with SBC To collaborating with the residents. We are developing a programme for 2021 to deliver the next phase.

#### Looking Ahead What does 2021 look like for the Stevenage MRC?

2021 will be focussed in the Pin Green and Chells area as Broadwater and Shephall areas draws to a close.

Wates have issued a forecast programme for all the remaining years on the MRC. 2021 will consist of 43 blocks, starting with Archer Road, Pin Green.

Archer Road package will commence from mid-January 2021 following the conclusion of the S20's, this phase will be Batch 4 of phase 3 and will complete in June 2021.





# **Commercial highlights**

Good relationships forged with Stevenage's consultants, FFT and regular meetings are in place. Application review meetings are in place which allows for a quick turnaround of monthly applications.

All payments by SBC are on time and within agreed time scales.

Wates is in line to achieve Stevenage's budgeted spend figures for 2020-21.

Final accounts have been issued for MRC Blocks Phase 1 and Garage Work Streams. Practical completion is due on Phase 2 blocks in 2020, meaning that Phase 2 final account will start to be issued in January 2021.

#### Surveys

We are currently in the process of completing all our block condition surveys for the remainder of the framework. This strategy is to provide Stevenage with visibility of the estimated outrun costs for the framework and to establish whether additional funding may be required. This will also provide Stevenage with an outline programme and completion dates for all blocks in the MRC programme.

#### Environmental

Wates have been in discussion with SBC and provided input regarding the Social Housing Decarbonisation Fund. It is hoped that this funding will be granted, this will contribute in a lasting way towards improving the environmental performance of the SBC's stock and reduce fuel poverty. Environmental and sustainable approaches are at the core of everything we do at Wates.





# Training and employment

### Business Administration Apprentice – x 1

James started his apprenticeship with Wates in July 2019, for a duration of approximately 18 months.

I hope you are all well, I just wanted to share my story with you all.

Last July, I finished my A-Level's, I had applied for university and had received my place and sorted my accommodation. I was ready to go, I was ecstatic with my grades I achieved and I could not wait to head off to start my university adventure.

However, after a couple of weeks of being there, I realised I was not ready for university and that it was not for me. So I decided to leave.

I continued to work my part time job that I was doing before I went off to university, but I very soon got bored and frustrated and wanted to do better things with my life. So I spoke to my parents and they suggested I applied for different jobs, apprenticeships and degree apprenticeships. For months I applied for so many roles, most of which I got ever so far with but was never offered the position. I felt like giving up completely.

But then, one day I received an email, an email to say that I was actually successful with an interview and that they wanted to offer me the position. I had to read this email over and over again to believe it, when I came to the realisation it was not a dream. It is a very good apprenticeship which is in a position I want to work in, this being business admin and is local, so makes it very convenient.

They were all so welcoming, supportive and are very easy to get on with. Since then, I have learnt some skills, grown so much in confidence and made what I consider to be not just work colleagues, but friends. We had an amazing works do over the summer (THANK YOU SUSZANNA!) and every time I work I just feel happier by the day.

Today (24/09/2019) also marks the day of my one month anniversary with my girlfriend, which I never thought I would say and I feel so lucky to have such an amazing girl play that part in my life.

#### Langley waterproofing and roofing systems apprentices – x 2

Working with our local supply chain Ash Roofing, we have been able to work with them to get two apprentices onto the Langley roofing apprenticeship scheme, which is directly involved in the roof renewals on the MRC Stevenage contract.







## Training and employment

#### North Herts College General Construction Course – May 2019

On 14<sup>th</sup> May 2019, Wates were invited to attend the General Construction Course which is run by North Hertfordshire College in partnership with DWP to deliver a talk to the participants of the course . Tom Joblin and Doina Caniparu attended the event and talked to the participants on the career pathways into construction, apprenticeship routes and how to get employed in the construction industry. This was an interactive talk with participants asking questions and being inquisitive about the careers in this industry.





### Community Chest Fund 2020

Wates proudly donated £2,500 towards the Community Chest Fund which looks at providing donations to community projects which should improve the economic, social or environmental well-being of people in Stevenage.

The winners of the donation were:

**Green Spaces** – The gardeners are a sub-group of the Green Space Volunteers under the auspices of the Council. The gardening team meets weekly to maintain the flower beds within the Town Centre Gardens.

**Covid the Cobra** – Covid the Cobra was a snake created out of painted rocks. He was created during lockdown and saw a community of all ages brought together during a time of uncertainty.

**Friends and Relatives Of Trotts Hill** – FROTH are a charity who support Trotts Hill primary and nursery school to buy much needed equipment and resources to support the children and their education.

### Residents Christmas Hampers – December 2020

The Wates site team have kindly donated Christmas hampers to 5 Stevenage residents. Our aim was to support members of the community who are vulnerable, may not have immediate family available to them or just having to long term self-isolate. Hopefully our small gesture will make Christmas 2020 more joyful and fulfilling to these residents.

### A Christmas Gift – November 2019

To keep up with the Christmas spirit, on 25<sup>th</sup> November 2019, the Wates team donated 60 advent calendars which were given to the Communities and Neighbourhoods Team to distribute between all play centres throughout Stevenage.

#### Helping Vulnerable Residents

Our Wates RLO, Danielle had a long term no access property which needed to be accessed for lateral mains works. The resident did not open the door to anyone, including her landlord for many years.



However, with lots of patience and perseverance, Danielle managed to get a connection with the resident and when the resident finally agreed to open the door, Danielle found out she was an extreme hoarder and embarrassed of how her home became in the last few years.

Danielle managed to get a group of caretakers to clear the residents home and arranged a Wates skip to dispose of all the items. Danielle said that her experience and how Mental Health First Aider course has helped her to see how more she can help her community. This is truly going the extra mile behaviour!



#### Haven Haircut Day – April 2019

Wates were pleased to attend the 2<sup>nd</sup> time to The Haven homeless shelter in April 2019 to give haircuts to ladies residing in the shelter. It was a good time to catch up with their progress and find out where Wates could support the shelter.



#### Haven Haircut Day – February 2019

On 19<sup>th</sup> February 2019, our Resident Liaison Officer Danielle Cracknell and her friend Natalie, gave haircuts to seven ladies currently living in Stevenage Haven. Stevenage Haven exists to provide shelter and support for single people experiencing homelessness in Stevenage and North Herts. It was amazing to see how confident the ladies from the shelter were after a little heartfelt TLC and all down to Danielle and Natalie volunteering their time and effort on the day.



### Symonds Green Pond Project Opening Day – January 2020

On 30<sup>th</sup> January 2020, Wates celebrated the Symonds Pond clearance project with the local council that our project team worked in partnership on with TCV, Mulalley and local resident volunteers back in October and November 2019 (see opposite page).

Students from North Herts College also supported the project by refurbishing a nearby bench and notice board to compliment the new pond. The celebrations highlighted the great work and lasting impact the new pond brings to the local community.



#### Symonds Green Pond Project – October 2019

As part of the social value commitment, Mulalley and Wates are giving £2,500 each per year for projects selected by Stevenage Borough Council. The Symonds Green pond project was highlighted to Wates and Mulalley in February 2019. The pond had overgrown vegetation that was overtaking the area of the pond. The pond needed work done to restore it to its previous glory.

Due to the intricate works involved in the project, Wates have involved TCV (The Conservation Volunteers), a charity which carries out only outdoor green spaces projects. With their knowledge and support, TCV met up with Stevenage Borough Council Green Spaces staff to come up with a MUST list of works needed to the pond to restore it back to what is was. A list was devised and volunteers were brought from different organisations such as: Wates, Mulalley, Stevenage Green Spaces, North Herts College students, Stevenage Borough Council and residents of Symonds Green Resident Group.

Together with the supervision and materials supplied by TCV, the works was completed during 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> November 2019. TCV attended a week later to complete the works on the pond. This was a big project with lots of activities and a lot of involvement from different organisations. A great example of partnering and teamwork!



### Bragbury End Residents Group Broadwater Day Event – September 2019

Wates donated a £500 marquee to Longmeadow and Bragbury End Residents Group on the Broadwater Day event.

Broadwater Day took place on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 from 12pm to 6pm and was a Garden Fete on the biggest park in the South of Stevenage.

The fete had live music, performances, stalls, rides, attractions and other wonderful things meant to make local residents smile!



### Stevenage Day Sponsorship Skip Donation – July 2019

Wates proudly donated £1,000 to Stevenage Day event. The sponsorship funded the main performance of the day, Pastiche – a troupe who do fire breathing and fire eating, they are now going to start the show, provide two other shows during the day and perform around the event.



#### Skip Donation at The Haven Organisation

Wates were approached by The Haven organisation to donate a refuge skip. This was asked as the centre needed some garages cleared in order to provide additional storage space. Wates donated a skip for a duration of 1 week, which was gladly received by the centre.

We supported the Haven centre again with another skip donation to assist their occupants and the centre with clearing their unwanted items. The skip was placed for 2 weeks and collected once it got filled up.

#### Community & Conservation Woodland Walk Project – June 2019

Every year Wates staff volunteer their hours in benefit for the community. On 20<sup>th</sup> June 2019 the focus was on creating greener, happier, and healthier communities.

The project in Stevenage that was brought to our attention by Bragbury End Community Garden Group was a wooded area which is running parallel to the railway line from Windsor Close to Pembridge Gardens (Blenheim Way).

Together with The Conservation Volunteers, Wates staff, Stevenage staff and Bragbury End Community Garden Group, we cleared away the dumped rubbish and maintained the area, enhancing it into an English woodland. This joint effort will help to make the area a special place to go for walkers, families and residents alike, and make residents feel proud of their area and helping to take care of it.

We were proud to have as guests the Mayor of Stevenage, Cllr Simon Speller and MP Stephen McPartland, who were happy to take part in the project. Well done to all involved to making a difference to the environment!


# **Resident engagement**

### 28<sup>th</sup> October – 8<sup>th</sup> November 2019

Building Futures is a two week pre-employment training programme for unemployed adults. It is accredited by the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) and provides basic construction training underpinned by employability skills to help participants make the transition into employment or training. Building Futures was launched by Wates in 2006 to tackle unemployment in the communities in which we work, as well as add value beyond construction.

Over 1,250 people have taken part in over 100 Building Futures programmes since its launch in 2006, and Wates have supported over 56% into employment or further learnings, either with Wates, our supply chain or other employers / training providers. This programme contains both practical and classroom based learning.

20 learners were selected from interview and invited to attend the programme, with 11 finishing it. The programme was run from Stevenage Rugby Club.

The programme also included a visit to a Wates construction site enabling the learners to experience a live site and learn about Wates as a company. The learners visited the Wates Major Refurbishment Contract in Stevenage and were taken on a tour by Project Manager, Daniel Aspinwall. They also took part in a mock site induction to see how Wates perform the site inductions on construction sites.

# 100 Personal Protective Equipment packs donation

Wates will kindly donate 100 PPE packs to vulnerable, shielding residents at the sheltered scheme Pinewoods, Stevenage. The packs will contain a face covering, a bottle of hand sanitizer and gloves. This pack will give that additional safety to residents in protecting them against coronavirus.

### December 2020 or January 2021

#### Action Day

Wates are working closely with Resident and Estate Services to identify fly tipping areas to organise an Action Day. This is to encourage residents from nearby areas to dispose of personal belongings and de-cluttering and avoid any future fly tipping offences.

#### January 2021

#### 500 Trees Donation

500 trees donated to Stevenage Borough Council Green Space Volunteers. In 2014, the Green Space Volunteers planted an acre of new woodland at the top of Fairlands Valley Park to commemorate the centenary of the start of WWI – The Memorial Wood. The 500 trees will be planted on the grassland immediately adjacent to this first area of woodland planting totalling to an acre of new woodland. Because of the Coronavirus etc, the Memorial Wood would become a lasting legacy project to remember not just those who have given their lives in wars, but also to those in the NHS and front line services that have taken care of us during 2020 and to those who have lost their lives to Covid-19.

Once the planting is done, Wates will donate and install a stone memorial in the centre to identify the woodland formally, and to acknowledge the contributors to the whole of the new wood.

The new trees to be planted are: Hawthorn, Rowan, Silver Birch (pictured on the right), Hazel, Common Oak, Dogwood, Hornbeam, Crab Apple, Field Maple and Common Alder. The trees are due for delivery on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2021, with planting to start the week after.
