Amendment to the experimental double yellow lines in Kilby Road

Stevenage Borough Council previously introduced experimental double yellow lines restrictions in Kilby Road following various concerns about obstructive parking taking place in that area.

After the introduction of these experimental 'no waiting at any time' restrictions, the Fire Service assessed the access on these roads for their fire appliances and confirmed that their vehicles were able to gain unhindered access to all parts of this road. However, some residents suggested that additional kerbside parking should be maintained on the east side of Kilby Road adjacent to properties 51-66 Kilby Road. This feedback has been taken into consideration and the initially implemented Experimental Order has been amended by removing parts of the initially proposed double yellow lines as shown on the enclosed plan.

Unlike a permanent traffic order where a formal consultation is undertaken, the Experimental Order is a more flexible approach. We would welcome your feedback throughout the duration of this experiment in order to collate information and make an informed decision at the end of this experiment.

Full details of these restrictions are set out in the sealed Experimental Amendment No 1 Order which comes into force on 1 September 2025, and together with the notice of making, the plan, and a statement of reasons for making the Order, can be examined during normal opening hours at the Council's offices in Daneshill House.
