**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Stevenage Borough Council, acting as agents for the Hertfordshire County Council and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police has made the above named Order under Sections 32-35C and Parts III-IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order has been made in order to better manage parking places to relieve and prevent congestion, and maintain and improve the amenity of the area by allowing the application of a three hour tariff band in the evenings and at weekends and comes into force on 4 September 2020.

The effect of this Order is be to update the tariff bands as set out below. The reference to "Retail Store Customer Driver" is necessary to reflect the original Order's wording that provides for a different tariff for customers of the retail store situated at 74A High Street.
