
How it Works

Referral Process –
 Families are referred through various channels, including schools, housing providers, health professionals and other professionals.

 Assessment - The support worker will assess the family's needs and will develop a support plan tailored to their specific situation.

- Intervention During the assessment the support worker will work with the family to address identified needs, using a combination of support and interventions.
- Monitoring and evaluation –
 The Family Intervention Project will evaluate the support given and interventions used to ensure the service is delivering its desired outcomes.

The Family Intervention Project (FIP) is a targeted support program for families facing complex challenges, often involving anti-social behaviour, tenancy issues, and risks of homelessness. These projects aim to improve family stability, prevent homelessness, and enhance opportunities for children. These services aim to support families in addressing issues such as parenting skills, school attendance, financial difficulties, domestic abuse, and other challenges, with the goal of preventing escalation to statutory interventions and promoting family well-being.
