- Financial advice and guidance
- Health advice and guidance
- Supporting children back into education
- Training and employment options for young people
- Parenting advice and guidance

How does it work?

Initial assessment:

The key worker will meet with you to discuss any issues or support required.

Support plan:

From the assessment, a plan will be put together where we agree support. There will be regular contact with your key worker.

Review and closure:

Your case will be regularly reviewed and when agreed will be closed and possibly referred to another agency.
