What is SADA?

Stevenage Against Domestic Abuse (SADA) is a holistic approach to working alongside survivors of domestic abuse, and support also extends to families. The service offers crisis intervention, together with client-led support and signposting to other agencies suited to the individual and their own situation. In the past 12 months, the service has grown and gained momentum across Hertfordshire. Once someone has come through the service, they gain access to our SADA Domestic Abuse Forum which is run by survivors who want to make a difference and continue that support system. A weekly drop-in is run in Stevenage and North Herts which provides extra support to victims, survivors and their families. The SADA service now runs in Stevenage, North Herts, and East Herts, and is being piloted in Welwyn Hatfield it will now continue for a further 12 months.

Police statistics of domestic abuse in Hertfordshire

Overall in Hertfordshire, the number of recorded 'notifiable' offences flagged with an aggravating factor of domestic abuse has decreased by -6.1%, when compared to the previous year; from 10,800 to 10,139.

Notable increases: in North Herts (4.2%) and Welwyn Hatfield (12.3%).

However, the total number of non-crime incidents fell by -2.8% in Hertfordshire. Again, more notable increases where seen East Herts (6.1%), and decreases from North Herts (-10.5%).


Stalking and harassment

Stalking is now defined in legislation and includes repeated attempts to impose unwanted communications and/or contacts on another in a manner that could be expected to cause distress and/or fear in any reasonable person.

There were 4,779 stalking and harassment offences recorded during the current period. This is an overall decrease of -3.9%. Notable increases where seen in Welwyn Hatfield (3.6%).

Referrals: April 2019 - March 2020





- · We have successfully identified repeat victims and repeat perpetrators
- We have two SADA Safe Spaces
- Community Safety Manager and SADA Team Leader have completed MARAC Chair Training
- Drop-ins in Stevenage and North Herts each week for survivors
- SADA has grown to Stevenage, North Herts, East Herts and Welwyn Hatfield
- SADA Pilot. In Welwyn Hatfield for three months in 2020 and now secured for a futher 12 months
- "Through Emily's Eyes" domestic abuse conference held in February 2020, this was attended by over 60 service providers/ partners
- Numerous events including the 16 Days of Action, SADA Christmas Party and partner presentations in areas which SADA are working with
- Attend secondary schools in Stevenage to provide healthy relationships talks to Year 7 and above with partners
