INTRODUCTION

As a member of the Co-operative Councils Innovation Network, Stevenage Borough Council is a local authority committed to reforming the way it works through building an equal partners hip with local people, based on the values and principles of the International Co-operative Alliance.

We will support the development of a framework and criteria for social value, giving substance to the concept and to ensure better local social and economic outcomes. Social Value can help support Community Wealth Building aims to revive local economies, renew trust in local services and deliver a renaissance of local government, by giving businesses and communities a bigger stake in the local economy.

We are committed to ensuring a high standard of ethical trade practices, across commissioning and procurement activities.

We expect suppliers, service providers and contractors to act with integrity and transparency in their dealings and practices, adhering to the laws of the countries where they operate.

Stevenage Borough Council has signed up to the Co-operative Party Charter against Modern Slavery which aims to establish ethical labour sourcing practices in our supply chain and establish robust recruitment processes.

We require all of our contractors to comply fully with the Modern Slavery Act 2015, wherever it applies, with contract termination as a potential sanction for non-compliance. Procurement can be the target of anti-competitive, fraudulent and corrupt activities.

The Council will take steps to minimise the opportunity for these and use clear policy statements and codes of conduct which are easily accessible by members, staff and the public.

This report aims to high light the work carried out by SBC and partners with regards to Social Value.



This project offers free repairs members of the community bring broken or damaged household items that would otherwise go to landfill to be repaired, avoiding going to landfill., with over a 50% success rate. Local, professional businesses, are also recommended and visitors encouraged to watch and learn repair skills for themselves. Following enquiries, we are setting up a tutorial group for basic sewing and carpentry skills. This funding ensures the project can continue for at least 12 months.




APPRENTICESHIP WEEK AT NORTH HERTS COLLEGE -JAN 2024




aimed at maximising opportunities for some of the harder to reach groups, and those within the community who face barriers to employment, including ex-offenders.

"The ROTL Programme has given me an opportunity to gain a good work ethic and engage with the community in a social and proactive way. It has also been had a positive impact with my family in that they can see that I am looking forward and turned my life around. It has given me a positive outlook in that a better life can be achieved in a working environment, rather than through criminality. It has also given me skills to be able to use when I am released.

When I started with Lovell, I was nervous in that as the staff knew my background, that I would be treated differently. This has proved not to be the case on the two sites I have worked on and I feel I am treated in the same fair way as anyone else. I have always been treated with respect and feel part of the team.

I would definitely recommend the programme to others. It gives people the opportunity to rehabilitate, turn their life around. It also can potentially give other opportunities through contacts made on site giving them a purpose in life following release" - ROTL Candidate

Mulalley Marketplace welcomed another fantastic partner to our material reuse scheme.

Vistry Group contacted the Mulalley Marketplace to find a new home for 100 packs of new condition Insulation Boards.

The boards were added and circulated on the Mulalley Marketplace and were soon snapped up by Social Enterprise Church Farm, Ardeley and Aldenham Country Park Care Farms who are a not-for-profit farming, food, care and education farm. They aim to enhance the countryside, provide people with special needs opportunities, conserve wildlife and farm ecologically.

Vistry Group and Mulalley split the costs of transporting the 80 packs of insulation boards to ensure there was no cost to the social enterprise. The farm will be using the insulation boards (for several projects including insulating a new School Cabin, some of the animal shelters and will be distributing some packs to other nearby charities.

The donation is worth £75,000 to the well used community farm!!!!


